A page from the hymnal...

ALL CREATURES OF OUR GOD AND KING



This hymn in praise of the God of Creation was originally written by Saint Francis of Assisi. Born Giovanni di Pietro Bernardone, c.1182, St. Francis was one of seven children of a prosperous silk merchant. A soldier, he was converted in 1209 after hearing a sermon based on Matthew 10:9; "Don't take any money in your money belts-no gold, silver, or even copper coins." He devoted himself to poverty and founded the Franciscan Order of Friars

("followers"). His rule for followers was "to follow the teachings of our Lord Jesus Christ and to walk in His footsteps." St. Francis died on October 3, 1226, while listening to a reading of Psalm 142. He was canonized on July 16, 1228 by Pope Gregory IX. He is the patron saint of animals and the environment and is the creator of the Christmas Nativity Scene, in 1220. This poem "Canticle of the Sun" was translated and set to music by William Henry Draper, sometime between 1899 and 1919. Draper was born in Kenilworth, Warwickshire, England on December 19, 1855. He was educated at Keble College, Oxford and was ordained in the Anglican Church in 1880. He wrote 60 hymns and published several hymnals. "All Creatures of Our God and King" is his only hymn included in our hymnal. Draper died on August 7, 1933 in Clifton, Bristol, Warwickshire, England.

The tune, LASST UNS ERFREUEN, ("Let Us Rejoice") was composed by Friedrich Spee, February 25, 1591 - August 7, 1635. Spee was a German poet, professor and priest. The tune was composed as an Easter hymn and was first published in 1623 in "Auserlesene Katholische Geistliche Kirchengesäng." The tune was adapted by Ralph Vaughan Williams (1872 - 1958) in 1906. This tune is also used for the hymns: "A Hymn of Glory Let Us Sing" (#322); "God's Holy Ways Are Just and True"" (#663); and a setting of the Doxology (#147).

"All creatures of our God and King, lift up your voice and with us sing Alleluia!"


